SUPPLEMENTAL SALES PERMITS LINKED TO BOARD ACTION NO. 27

Rationale: Board Action No. 27 identifies “tractor models” that require performance testing to meet the Nebraska Statute. This definition of model could result in several different model designations from a manufacturer being considered the same model for testing purposes. This Board Action defines the process to identify the manufacturer’s tractor model designations for which the test report and sales permit(s) apply.

When a manufacturer applies for an original sales permit, the manufacturer will declare on the application all known manufacturer’s model designations that constitute the same “tractor model” according to Board Action No. 27. The manufacturer will submit documentation demonstrating that each of the manufacturer’s model designations meet the specifications for that “tractor model” according to Board Action No. 27.

When new manufacturer’s model designations are later introduced having the same “tractor model” specifications according to Board Action No. 27 as listed on an original sales permit, the manufacturer can apply for a supplemental sales permit according to Board Action No. 5. When a manufacturer applies for a supplemental sales permit, the manufacturer will declare on the application all new manufacturer’s model designations that constitute the same “tractor model” according to Board Action No. 27 as on the original sales permit. The manufacturer will submit documentation demonstrating that each of the manufacturer’s model designations meet the specifications for that “tractor model” according to Board Action No. 27.

Upon receipt of an application for a supplemental sales permit with supporting documentation, the Board will recommend that a supplemental sales permit be issued by the Department of Agriculture for the new manufacturer's model designation. Fees as described in Section 2-2805.01 of the Nebraska Tractor Engine Testing Law will apply. The Board will reprint the appropriate test report to include the new manufacturer's model designation. Costs associated with reprinting the test report will be charged to the manufacturer.
