WITHDRAWAL OF A TRACTOR FROM A NEBRASKA TRACTOR TEST

\*\*\*\*\*

The following rules apply to the withdrawal of a tractor under an official test at the Nebraska Tractor Test Laboratory:

1. The official test begins with signatures from the manufacturer's representative and the Nebraska Tractor Test Laboratory's representative indicating that the official test has started.

The official test continues until all inspections and any additional tests required by the Board are completed and the official test terminated by the manufacturer's representative and the Nebraska Tractor Test Laboratory's representative signing off that the official test has terminated. The tractor is then released to the applicant, or others so authorized by the applicant, for removal from the Nebraska Tractor Test Laboratory.

2. The Nebraska sales permit status will govern withdrawals from the official test.
  - a. Temporary sales permit issued.
    - 1) A tractor may not be withdrawn from official test.
      - a) A report will be issued and will include the results of the final inspection.
      - b) If the tractor model does not meet the advertised claims, Section 2-2701(3)(b) of the Nebraska Tractor Engine Testing Law applies.
    - 2) A tractor may be withdrawn prior to the start of the official test under extraordinary circumstances only upon approval of the Board.

- a) Another tractor of the same model with identical specifications must be returned for official test (under a new test number) within a time period specified by the Board.
  - b) It will be reported that a tractor was withdrawn from test with the permission of the Nebraska Tractor Test Board, no report will be issued and the test number will not be used again.
- b. A temporary sales permit has not been requested or issued.
- 1) The tractor model may be withdrawn at any time.
  - 2) It will be reported that a tractor was withdrawn from test with the permission of the Nebraska Tractor Test Board, no report will be issued and the test number will not be used again.
  - 3) A subsequent application for a temporary sales permit for the tractor model will be forwarded to the Department of Agriculture with a recommendation that the application be denied.
